

# Enrolment

What does it mean?

Once an Inuvialuk **turns 18** they are eligible to apply for enrolment under the Inuvialuit Trust.



Once enrolled, they are **officially a beneficiary** of the Inuvialuit Final Agreement (IFA)



Beneficiaries have access to different levels of **support and opportunities** to assist them or supplement their way of life.



Beneficiaries from another land claim cannot also be beneficiaries of the IFA.

a range of supports offered to Inuvialuit



Indigenous-specific Health Canada and non-insured health benefits



grants through Inuvialuit Education Fund

## Registration

What is registration?

- confirms Inuvialuit eligibility
- can happen any time before age 18
- is not automatic when a child is born
- grants access to opportunities for Inuvialuit

Like registration, enrolment does not happen automatically and must be applied for when eligible.

The Inuvialuit Final Agreement was created to ensure the preservation of Inuvialuit culture, our Arctic ecosystem and to secure a place for Inuvialuit to be meaningful participants in our northern and national economy.
